Global Mission Partners are hosting BJ and Chipo Mpofu in Australia from November 8th–24th to share how God's love is transforming communities in Zimbabwe with the help of his many friends and supporters in Australia.

This is an opportunity to hear from the Mpofu's about the transformational ministries in Zimbabwe and to reconnect with them. With BJ's support and guidance, along with other Christian leaders, over 77 churches have been planted, and over three thousand people have committed their lives to Christ. This year alone, the churches have baptised over 195 people. BJ has a strong connection to the global movement of churches of Christ, having previously been the president of the World Convention (of churches of Christ). BREAKING GROUND PATHWAY

On Wednesday night, as you enter our reflective worship space, you will be invited to journey along a reflective path into the Auditorium.

START HERE

1. The pathway invites you to engage as if you were wandering through a botanical garden. It's not about a destination; it's about the journey and the wonders you discover along the way.

4. When your journey concludes, take a seat and be sure to hold onto your pot for the session ahead.

2. Before you enter, please collect a small organic pot and fill it halfway with soil.

3. As you explore, pause to immerse yourself in the creative pieces and words along the way. If certain expressions resonate with you, take a seed and plant it in your pot, asking God to let this grow within you during our time together.

OPEN SPACE TECHNOLOGY

Michael Wood is facilitating our conversations at Collective using a method of meeting called 'Open Space Technology'.

What will these conversations look like?

Michael Wood has been an Anglican Priest for 28 years and is now a Community Chaplain in Richmond, Victoria. Alongside this ministry, Michael is a professional facilitator of Open Space Technology. He uses this method of conversation to enable groups to have respectful and productive conversations about ideas they really care about.

Open Space Technology (OST) is a simple way to run productive, selforganising conversations. It has been used for groups of five to 2000+ people at a time.

In OST, participants create and manage their own agenda of conversations, beginning with a central theme or question. Participants are given the freedom to propose and initiate topics for conversations and to join conversations raised by others that align with their interests, expertise, and passion.

These conversations are documented, and participants are given an opportunity



for action planning if they wish to take responsibility for continuing particular conversations after the conference.

Why are we using Open Space Technology?

OST was originally designed by Harrison Owen, an episcopal priest, when he noticed that the most energising conversations people have at conferences usually happen outside of directed sessions. These conversations happen because people self-organise to have the conversations that matter to them!

Over the years, we have noticed a similar phenomenon at Collective, which is why this year we are dedicating space to enable you to have the conversations that matter most to you. We believe that to attend to what God has for us to do and to be in partnership together in the future, we must begin by exploring the diverse passions God has given us and be ready to listen deeply to each other.

REFRESH ACTIVITIES

Thursday 4 - 5.30pm

The purpose of this hour and a half is to take a breather after a full afternoon of conversation before entering our celebration event. What do you need to reset? Choose your own adventure:

Go for a bush walk

The Tops have self-guided walking trails. Ask for a map from reception, gather a small group and follow the trail markers. The scenic cliff-line trail begins behind Boronia. Please inform others if you intend to go alone.

Head to the pool and tennis court

The Tops pool and tennis court are ours to use! Grab a crew and head down for a pool party or game of tennis. Please ensure children are supervised at all times near the pool and clean up on your way out.

Grab a drink at The Imperial Hotel

Spend time in the Prayer Room

The Prayer Room (located in Banksia meeting room) is an invitational space where you can relax and focus your attention on God. It is a quiet place which encourages and accepts different expressions of prayer. Creative expression, reflection, deep listening, and honest communication can happen.

ANNOUNCEMENT: UPCOMING CHANGES TO OPD

Throughout 2024, a working group (consisting of people across our network) have been discussing the current Ongoing Professional Development (OPD) system, with a view to make necessary modifications to ensure that this system is fit for purpose for who we are as a diverse network of churches and ministries. Changes have been proposed to and approved by the Endorsement Review Group (ERG).

The current OPD system will continue to operate until the end of June, 2025.

From July 2025 to the end of December 2025, there will be a grace period where no OPD will need to be submitted. The new system of Ongoing Ministry Development (OMD) will commence in 2026 and will run across the calendar year.

What changes are being proposed?

A new framework is being proposed which aligns with the reality that, as

churches of Christ, we are a network of locally-governed churches. Therefore, the onus and accountability for each endorsed leader lies with the church he or she is employed by.

In the **essentials**, we will be unified. These elements will continue to be overseen by the Network Resource Team (NRT) as part of each leader's endorsement with churches of Christ NSW & ACT.

These elements are:

- Receive supervision (8 sessions per year with a suitably qualified supervisor – pro rata)
- Maintain Creating Safe Spaces training (every 4 years)
- Attend Pilgrimage (once)

In the **non-essentials**, we will encourage each leader to engage in contextual activities that serve their individual needs and season of ministry. These elements will be divided into three broad categories:

Soul

This is who you are!

The focus is to be *refreshed and inspired*. This involves your identity in Christ. This encompasses your whole being (spiritual, mental, physical, emotional health).

Role

This is about what you have been employed to do!

The focus is to be *equipped*. This encompasses building your capacity to meet the expectations of your role.

Context

This is about where you are!

The focus is to be *stretched* to serve and connect beyond your local employment. This encompasses connection points with local community, the wider church, local government, mission agencies, community groups, etc.
