Our team can't wait to welcome your kids to learn, play, and grow! To have your child ready for this fun-filled couple of days, here's what to pack for your children each day:


- Water bottle (clearly labelled)

Now you are invited to step into that same sacred rhythm.


The Bellies are releasing a free Formation Resource which includes both a small group guide and a quick reference guide for using the journal, to deepen the formation of others.
