Applying for Sabbatical Grants

through Churches of Christ (NSW & ACT)

We estimate it costs on average \$20,000 to take a sabbatical. According to this model, a churches of Christ Sabbatical Grant can cover 50% of this, or \$10,000.

Who can receive funds?

- Grants are paid to the church, not to individuals
- All paid staff at a church, whether senior or junior, full-time or part-time

What can funds be used for?

For Church

- Cost of interim minister
- Travel and accommodation
- Paying staff to work additional hours

For Pastors

- Intentional Retreats
- Counselling, Psychology, Spiritual Direction
- Study
- Attend events and conferences
- Travel and accommodation

Again, we reiterate the areas of depletion would be the areas to which funding is directed. For example, if it is family relationships that have most suffered depletion from the role, then it would be appropriate that funds are directed to counselling, family experiences, etc.

If it is in academic learning, then funding a study sabbatical would be appropriate. On this point, another resource is a separate fund which has been set up to support sabbaticals for those of the united reformed tradition, which includes churches of Christ.
